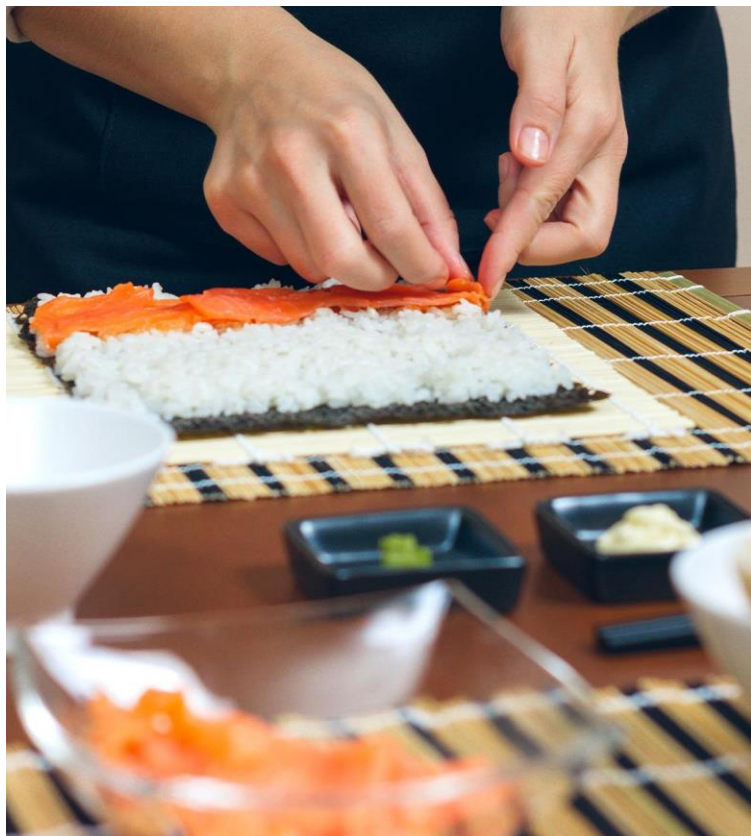

Day 1: Friday, March 17, 2028 Overnight Flight You're bound for Japan! Soon you'll wander Tokyo's museums, witness sumo, ascend to Mt. Fuji's 5th Station, stroll through a bamboo grove, and roll sushi. Tonight is your first step on this journey.

Day 2: Saturday, March 18, 2028 Tokyo, Japan Today, you arrive in Tokyo, a city where neon towers and tranquil shrines stand side by side. With no scheduled activities, tailor your first impressions of the "Land of the Rising Sun" at your own pace. Navigate Shibuya's Scramble Crossing, pause at a neighborhood shrine, savor sushi at a tiny eatery, or wander into an anime shop. From gardens to crowded alleyways, Tokyo's mix of ancient ritual and modern energy is yours to discover before you meet your travel companions tomorrow.

Day 3: Sunday, March 19, 2028 Tokyo Your day begins with an exploration of Tokyo, a city steeped in art and history. Visit the Tokyo National Museum, where Buddhist statues, samurai armor, and *ukiyo-e* prints tell centuries of stories. At the Imperial Palace, see the moats and walls that encircle its serene East Gardens. In the evening, stroll through Ginza's polished streets, where history meets modern commerce. End the day at a local restaurant where you'll sample regional dishes. (B, D)

Day 4: Monday, March 20, 2028 Tokyo Begin your day by stepping inside a sumo stable for a private demonstration and learn about the discipline, diet, and rituals of Japan's wrestlers. Witness the flickering flames and rhythmic chants of a *Goma* fire ritual at Fukagawa Fudo-do Temple. Tokyo's treasures are yours to explore at leisure this afternoon. Venture out into the city's neighborhoods, shop for crafts, sip matcha in a teahouse, or seek out a hidden shrine. (B)

Day 5: Tuesday, March 21, 2028 Tokyo - Mt. Fuji 5th Station - Hakone Depart Tokyo this morning and travel through a haven of natural beauty toward Mount Fuji. Stop at the 5th Station on the volcano's slopes to gaze up at its snow-capped cone and take in the splendor of the iconic peak.* Your journey continues in Hakone, a hot-spring resort town, where tonight you'll stay in a *ryokan*** (a traditional Japanese inn) with *tatami* floors and sliding paper doors. After settling into your room, sit down to a multi-course *kaiseki* feast and a display of culinary artistry featuring seasonal ingredients. (B, D)

Day 6: Wednesday, March 22, 2028 Hakone Up, up, and away! Today's adventures begin with a ride up the Komagatake Ropeway and a short walk*** to the summit for panoramic views over Hakone. Descend and cruise across Lake Ashi to the historic Sekisho-ato Pier, a historic checkpoint from the Edo period. Back on land, follow the Old Tokaido Highway and stroll beneath towering cedar trees on Ancient Cedar Avenue,**** a route once traveled by samurai. Wander among sculptures at the Hakone Open-Air Museum before concluding your day with a traditional *shabu-shabu* hot pot and meeting a *geisha*. (B, D)

Day 7: Thursday, March 23, 2028 Hakone - Kyoto This morning, the *Shinkansen* bullet train***** glides you along in your journey toward Kyoto. After settling into your hotel, it's time to stroll along Pontocho, a notable alley of dining experiences that runs beside the Kamo River. Here, lantern-lit wooden houses hide long-standing eateries and modern bars serving *yakitori*, *tempura*, and *sake*. Feel Kyoto's timeless atmosphere as you wander through alleys under glowing paper lanterns. (B)

Day 8: Friday, March 24, 2028 Kyoto Rise early to greet the day and beat the crowds with a visit to the peaceful Fushimi Inari Shrine. Walk beneath thousands of vermilion *torii* gates climbing the forested hillside and pause at shrines along the way. This afternoon, head to Kyoto's historic Gion district, where *geisha* still glide along flagstone lanes lined with teahouses and *machiya* townhouses. Sample *wagashi* sweets or *matcha* cakes as you explore the surrounding neighborhood. (B)

Day 9: Saturday, March 25, 2028 Kyoto The morning is yours to uncover more of Kyoto. Perhaps visit a quiet temple, shop for crafts, or relax in a teahouse. At midday, walk through the Arashiyama Bamboo Grove, where swaying stalks create a green tunnel. Tour Nijo Castle (UNESCO), whose creaking nightingale floors recall the shoguns. Roll up your sleeves for tonight's dinner. You'll be learning the art of making sushi as you join a local chef to prepare your meal before dining on your creations. (B, D)

Day 10: Sunday, March 26, 2028 Kyoto - Osaka Leave Kyoto for Nara this morning. In Nara Park, stroll among bowing deer and visit Todaiji Temple to see its giant bronze Buddha. In Osaka, join a guided walk along the neon-bright streets of Dotonbori and Shinsaibashi, lined with street food stalls and boutiques. The evening is yours to sample *takoyaki*, *okonomiyaki*, and other specialties in Japan's culinary capital at your leisure. (B)

Day 11: Monday, March 27, 2028 Osaka Today, you'll get insight into a traditional form of Japanese culture with a private *taiko* drumming lesson before heading to Osaka Castle Park***** to learn about the city's samurai heritage. The rest of the afternoon is yours to get acquainted with Osaka. You might visit a museum, cruise the canal, shop in Umeda, or snack on street food. As evening approaches, gather with your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner celebrating your journey through Japan. (B, D)

Day 12: Tuesday, March 28, 2028 Osaka - Tour Ends After breakfast, your tour comes to an end, but the spirit of Japan remains in your heart. (B)

Important Tour Information:

Book Now rates valid until Jun 18, 2027, valid on air inclusive packages only.

The overall activity level of this tour is a level 4. This means you're ready to seize the day, whatever it may bring. You lead an active life at home (walking, biking, and half or full day hikes are things you may enjoy) and 10,000 steps a day is normal for you. You can handle longer walking tours (more than 3 hours covering 3+ miles at a steady clip) and activities that involve traversing uneven terrain, steep slopes, standing for periods of time, and varying altitudes and temperatures. You don't mind being on the go with some early starts, late nights, and full days. You can handle altitudes of 9,000 feet or higher with little to no issue. This level is not appropriate for travelers who use wheelchairs, walkers, and other mobility assistance devices.

Travel with an average of 19 people (maximum of 24).

***There is approximately 20 minutes of walking to reach the summit of Komagatake.

****The walk along Ancient Cedar Avenue covers a distance of 1.25 miles / 2 kilometers and takes approximately 30 minutes.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at the time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

Unfortunately, wheelchairs cannot be accommodated on this tour. In addition, travelers who require assistance walking or who travel with oxygen tanks will not fully enjoy this trip, and we strongly recommend a different tour.

The maximum elevation experienced on this tour is at Mount Fuji Station, which is 7546 feet / 2300 meters.

In the case of extreme summer heat and humidity, walking tours may be shortened, rescheduled, or replaced with alternative activities to ensure traveler comfort and safety. The days and order of sightseeing may change to best utilize your time on tour.

*****Entrance to Osaka Castle is not included with your tour.

*Mt. Fuji is only visible from the train on a clear day and cannot be guaranteed based on weather conditions. In the event of poor weather, the Subaru Line and Mt. Fuji 5th Station may be closed and inaccessible. In this instance, you will visit an alternative facility.

Museum visits and shopping may be affected by the observance of religious or local holidays. Some venues, such as temples and shrines, require travelers to remove their shoes in order to enter. We recommend wearing footwear that is easily removed these days.

Golden Week is a cluster of national holidays in Japan, including Showa Day (April 29th), Constitution Memorial Day (May 3rd), Greenery Day (May 4th), and Children's Day (May 5th). During Golden Week, popular tourist destinations tend to be extremely crowded, and many businesses, including attractions and restaurants, operate on altered schedules. It's essential to anticipate traffic congestion and longer than usual wait times for any attractions and transportation. We reserve the right to modify the order of your inclusions during this period, without prior notice.

The Bon holiday (Obon) is a Buddhist holiday honoring the spirits of ancestors that occurs in mid-August. During the Bon holiday, many Japanese people travel to their hometowns to pay respects to their ancestors, resulting in increased traffic congestion and crowded public transportation. Some businesses may also close or operate with reduced hours during this time.

**This tour features a 2-night stay at a *ryokan*-style hotel. All travelers will sleep on a futon that is placed on the floor. Therefore, this tour is not recommended for those with mobility restrictions. The guest rooms and dining areas at the *ryokan* are covered with *tatami* mats, and shoes and slippers are not permitted inside the rooms. Luggage must be carried in, it cannot be rolled in. There is no portage available at this hotel, so you'll need to carry your own luggage to and from your room. The *ryokan* features communal, gender-separated hot spring baths (*onsen*), including an open-air bath with beautiful views. Clothing, including bathing suits, is not permitted in the *onsens*.

Single accommodations are limited and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Single rate subject to change based on availability.

Triple and child accommodations are not available.

If you have dietary restrictions or food allergies, please notify us at the time of booking. While we do our best to accommodate requests, options may be limited and cannot be guaranteed.

Travel Requirements:

Passports are required for this tour at your expense. Certain countries require that your passport be valid at least 6 months beyond the dates of your travel. 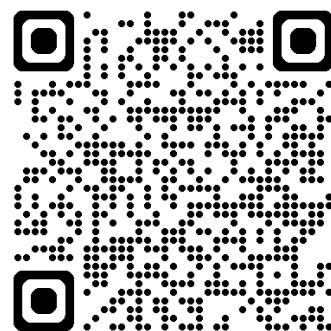
A visa for Japan is not required for stays of less than 90 days for U.S., Canadian, Australian, or New Zealand passport holders.

Day 12: Osaka - Hiroshima

Your journey continues as you travel by *Shinkansen* bullet train* to Hiroshima. On arrival, visit Orizuru Tower for elevated views of the city and surrounding landmarks. A lively pedestrian street lined with shops and eateries, the Hondori Shopping Arcade is a fun way to experience the sights, sounds, and tastes on your first afternoon in the city. This evening, your tastebuds continue to explore Japan's culinary offerings with dinner at a local restaurant. If you choose, round out your evening with a bit of Hiroshima's nightlife, perhaps stopping by an *izakaya* or enjoying karaoke. *Today dinner will be included.*

Day 13: Hiroshima

Today, travel to Miyajima Island, also known as Shrine Island, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that is home to the Itsukushima Shrine and its iconic O Torii Gate rising from the water. The Miyajima Ropeway takes you partway up Mt. Misen for sweeping views across the Seto Inland Sea. This afternoon, return to Hiroshima for a free afternoon and evening to explore at your own pace. *Today breakfast will be included.*

Day 14: Hiroshima

This morning brings you a day of learning and reflection as you walk a short distance from your hotel to the Peace Memorial Park. Pause to see the Atomic Bomb Dome (UNESCO), a somber reminder of the destruction Hiroshima faced during World War II. A visit to the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum gives you a deeper understanding of the events and personal stories of those affected. The remainder of the day is yours to explore Hiroshima at leisure. Perhaps you'll extend your time at the Peace Park, or try Hiroshima-style *okonomiyaki*, a local savory specialty. This evening, gather for a farewell dinner at a local restaurant. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

Day 15: Hiroshima - Extension Ends

Bid farewell to Japan as you head home with memories and photos to last a lifetime. *Today breakfast will be included.*

Important Tour Extension Information:

The overall activity level of this extension is a level 3. This means walking and standing for longer periods of time (2-3 hours) isn't a big deal for you. You can navigate hills and uneven ground, climb into various modes of transportation (tuk-tuk, cable car, zodiac, etc.), and could possibly anticipate changes in elevation. Walking four miles over the course of a day is very doable as is climbing 3 flights of stairs. You can handle altitudes between 6,000 and 9,000 feet. You can expect some longer days balanced with free time. This level is not a fit for travelers that require mobility assistance devices.

Fully-guided extensions are a great way to explore a new destination. Enjoy sightseeing and local experiences led by a Tour Manager or local expert.

We reserve the right to cancel this extension if a minimum of 4 travelers is not met to operate.

Extensions are subject to availability and applicable charges at time of request.

*On day one of the extension, travelers will need to carry their own luggage on the *Shinkansen* to Hiroshima, and to the taxi transfer from the train station to the hotel. There will be no luggage transport services available on this day.

This form must be remitted within 14 days of receipt for any special needs accommodation request.

Collette cannot provide special individual assistance to tour members with special needs for walking, dining, or other routine activities and motorized scooters are not permitted on tour.
